Architectural Description

General Architectural Description:

The building at 1203 W Marvin Ave is a one-story single-family house built about 1920, as estimated by field personnel based on its physical characteristics. The property was originally built for residential purposes, and its use remains unchanged. It displays features associated with the Craftsman movement, which was popularized in magazines and pattern books from the early- to mid-twentieth century. Its plan is indicative of a bungalow, a domestic house form that was popular from the 1910s to the 1930s. The building has a side-gabled roof. The windows are double-hung with wood sashes. The building has a single-door primary entrance with a wood doorway and frame. Porch feature(s) include the following: tapered wood box columns. Landscape feature(s) include the following: walkways. The only ancillary building on the property is a garage.
